



## Waterproofing of Norman house a 2-storey basement on the Strand London

The 1920s building currently being refurbished at 105-109 Strand is to be renamed Savoy Strand to reflect its history and heritage as part of the Duchy's historic Savoy Estate.

The building formally known as Norman House is being totally transformed to provide a new landmark connecting the Strand, one of London's busiest commercial streets.

Wykamol registered installer Advance Property Preservation were appointed to carry out the Below Ground waterproofing on this historic building conversion.
